



# Our definition of “missionary work”

In the World Missions Academy we define “missionary work” as follows. **Missionary work is the divine and imperative commission that the Church has received to evangelize and make disciples, beyond the current sphere of evangelical influence, by going (in the person of**

**their representative or ambassador) to where this unsaved population lives, by presenting the gospel in a persuasive and effective manner, by teaching all that Christ has commanded us, and by founding new churches (according to need) that aim at evangelization, discipleship, and the application of the biblical message and principles to the particular socio-cultural context of this new church and beyond.**
